SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA*

Scholarship amounts are renewable annually for four years.
Grades and test scores will be reviewed through May 1, 2025.

3.25–3.44	\$24,000 DEAN'S SCHOLARSHIP
3.00–3.24	\$21,000 ALUMNI AWARD

*Wabash College practices test-optional admission. Applicants are not required to submit standardized test scores as part of their application for admission.

Early Decision Scholarship \$4,000 scholarship in addition to merit.	Apply Early Decision to the College by November 15, 2024.	A holistic review of your academic achievements, including grade trend, strength of curriculum, test scores (if submitted), and class rank (if available).
Wabash College Lilly Awards Tuition, fees, on-campus housing and food each year. More than \$240,000 over four years.	Complete application for admission and submit the Lilly Award application by January 5, 2025.	Based on character, creativity, and academic accomplishment. Finalists interviewed February 23–24, 2025.
Snodell Scholarships Up to \$10,000 each year for four years.	Apply for admission by January 15, 2025.	Based on residence in Chicago, northern Illinois, southern Wisconsin, and eastern Iowa. Academically qualified Federal Pell Grant recipients will receive grants to cover the balance of all tuition and fees not covered by government grants.

WABASH COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID PROCESS CHECKLIST

STEP 1

- WHAT:** **Create a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID** (one for the student, one for the parent)
WHY: FSA IDs are used to electronically sign the FAFSA
WHERE: Apply at <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account>
WHEN: **Due as soon as possible and is necessary to submit the FAFSA**

STEP 2

- WHAT:** **Complete Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**
WHY: To apply for eligible need-based financial assistance at the federal and state levels (including Federal Direct Student and Parent PLUS Loans)
WHERE: Complete at <https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/>
WHEN: Available October 1, 2024 – **We recommend that students file as soon as possible. Please submit by February 1, 2025 for Wabash processing.**
